### Sale 39 | 'Maritime Pictures - Pilalas' | 30<sup>th</sup> June 2026

As of 1 April 2024 UK Government regulations relating to Artist's Resale Rights have been amended so that they now apply to all original works of art where the sale price in the secondary market reaches or exceeds **£1,000** rather than the previous figure of **Euros 1,000**. Still applicable to fine & decorative arts sold during the lifetime of the creator or for a period of 70 years after the creator's death.

We have yet to identify any shipper that can export/import ivory - *of any shape or type*, including marine – through U.S. Custom authorities. These authorities are presently unable to determine age or type and require DNA testing to prove it is not banned African elephant ivory. Charles Miller Ltd would also be unable to post to the U.S.A. any items containing ivory. Consequently, at the present time, any shipping (after settlement of our invoice) would be entirely at the **buyer's own risk**. At the very least long delays may be expected U.S. side, and in the worst instance lots could be destroyed. Please note that as of January 2022, the EU has banned the import of any item containing elephant ivory.

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Lot 55 – The provenance of this artwork has been amended – It was commissioned by *Inflexible's* Captain at the Dardanelles, Richard F. Phillimore, and was then sold at Duke's of Dorchester in their 10 March 2005 sale, lot 241.

Lot 59 – this artwork was not sold in the Bonhams 2019 sale, as stated in the printed catalogue.

Lot 70 – This artwork is gouache on board.

Lot 107 – This artwork is subject to Artist Resale Right.

Lot 128 – This artwork is oil on canvas laid to board.

Lot 128 – the title in the printed catalogue should read "*The Busy Port: A destroyer entering Falmouth Harbour protected by barrage balloons during World War II*".

Lot 131 – the description in the printed catalogue should read "*together with a watercolour of a dazzled minesweeper (H.M.S. Friendship), thought to be in the same hand*".

Lot 143 – the title in the printed catalogue should read "*H.M. Cruiser 'Liverpool' by a Titan crane, Rosyth, circa 1945*".
